



Al igual que las personas, todos los animales orinan y defecan (caca). Al igual que las huellas, la caca (excremento) de un tipo de animal puede ser bastante diferente a la de otro. Las heces de comadrejas, zorros y coyotes son largas y estrechas, con forma de dedo. Mientras que la caca de venado, ratón y conejo tiene forma de pelotillas. Mientras más grande sea el animal, jmás grandes serán las pelotillas de heces!



Just like people, all animals have to pee and poop. Just like tracks, the poop (scat) of one kind of animal can look quite different from the scat of another animal. Weasel, fox and coyote scat is long and narrow, shaped like a finger. Deer, moose, mouse and rabbit scat is in the form of pellets. The bigger the animal, the bigger the pellets!


Lessons Learned

Establish your touchstones and guiding principles.

- Work at the Speed of Trust.
- Listen, listen, listen and act!
- Be mindful of partners' resources and time.
- Don't force the partnership.
- Consider a framework for the approach.

Be realistic about your resources!

- Scale appropriately.
- Conserve what uses the most time?
- How many partners achieves the right balance?
- Can you secure consistent funding? If not, consider very carefully
