Our goal: Create a **permanent, consistent, equitable** *Nature for All* fund for protecting, restoring, and stewarding our forests, farms, wildlife habitat, parks, and water resources, especially those in EJ communities.

\$100M

Fully dedicated to nature each year

No new taxes involved

Who's eligible for the funding?

- State agencies
- Cities, towns, and regional governments
- Land trusts
- Watershed associations
- Community groups



Massachusetts' Conservation & Climate Goals

- Protect 30% of MA's lands and water by 2030, 40% by 2050
- Steward these lands to effectively support biodiversity, carbon, and other ecosystem services
- Increase access to nature for environmental justice communities
- Secure 11% of MA's carbon emissions removed by natural lands each year, while improving resilience to climate impacts









Pathways to Success for Nature for MA

Legislative

An Act Providing Nature for All (H. 901/S. 597) sponsored by Sen. Feeney, Reps. Blais and Montaño, now has over 40 co-sponsors. Senate bill was reported favorably from the Environment committee.

Ballot Initiative

Go directly to registered voters with a referendum to **vote Yes on Nature for MA** on Nov. 3, 2026

Can this Win at the Ballot?

A summer poll of likely MA voters from across the state showed very strong support:

- Nearly 70% would vote yes today for a ballot question to increase funding for nature
- Even when presented with arguments against, support stays in mid-to-high 60%
- Clean water polls as the most popular of the benefits of conserving land
